- Rich collection of various reference sources such as Encyclopedias, Dictionaries, Atlas and Year books etc. is there in our library.

DCAC has setup E-Library with computer and internet facility to provide access to E-resources which can be remotely accessed through N-LIST program of INFLIBNET and a host of high quality electronic database subscribed by Delhi University Library System (DULS) and DELNET, which is equally accessible to both teachers and students.

This year DCAC library started WEB-OPAC availability on Intranet & users can now check the availability of library resources online within the college campus.



New books are shelved on the "New Arrivals" shelves for a limited amount of time in order that library users may have a chance to browse new acquisitions. These new books are shelved on the bookcase between the entrance and exit gates.



## **E-RESOURCE**



Electronic resources (or e-resources) are materials in digital format accessible electronically. To provide information services to faculty members and students to support their research, teaching, and learning needs. To identify, acquire, and make available the widest range of relevant information in various formats. Examples of e-resources are electronic journals (e-journal), electronic books (e-book) online databases in varied digital formats, Adobe Acrobat documents (.pdf), webpages.

#### **LIBRARY RULES FOR ISSUING BOOKS**

> Identity card is a must while visiting and using the library.

- > Readers shall not write upon, damage, or make any mark upon any book, journal or magazine, or any other material belonging to the library.
- > Borrowers must satisfy themselves about the physical condition of the book before borrowing. Otherwise they will be responsible for any damage at the time of returning.
- > Books borrowed on a particular day will not be accepted for return on the same day.
- > Books taken out for reading or reference from the stack shall be left on the table and they should not be merged on the shelves.

#### LIBRARY RULES REGARDING CHARGES

- > An overdue charges of Re.1/per day per volume will be charged at the time of returning the books after the due date from all students.
- > Loss of book by the borrower should be replaced to the circulation counter immediately to avoid the fine.
- > The borrower shall either replace the book within 15 days or pay the cost of the book.

### LIBRARY DCAC WEB OPAC (KOHA) OF LIBRARY

Welcome to DCAC "WEB OPAC (KOHA)" of Library. The Library has installed a web-based search platform, which brings the bibliographic database of the DCAC books. Members can go to their library accounts through Intranet and can see their Library Status as well as the status of the book. The Web OPAC allows you search for an item of your choice in Library holdings. The library provides information about its collection through WEB OPAC. Two terminals of Web OPAC are available in the library in the stack area and one terminal is in the reading room.

The detailed instructions are provided "Steps to Follow" for using the Web OPAC to make them more expressive/understandable to the users.

# WHAT IS KOHA ?

Koha is an Integrated Library System with a range of features including: Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) module which provides a simple and clear interface for library users to perform tasks such as searching and reserving items and suggesting new items.

The KOHA software facilitates remote access to data regarding college library holdings including their locations, book status and user membership transactions.
