## From the Principal's Desk

With immense pleasure and pride, I present before you the Annual Report of Delhi College of Arts & Commerce, University of Delhi, for the academic year 2021-2022. This Report provides an insight into the achievements of the students, teaching faculty and the non-teaching staff of the college for the academic year and sets a roadmap for our future goals. A perusal of the Report will highlight the contribution of all stakeholders maintaining a high standard of performance in the various activities that were conducted in the college.

Delhi College of Arts & Commerce was established in 1987. In the decade and a half since its inception it has established itself as a premier institution of the University of Delhi. Over the course of the years our students have excelled in various fields: academics, sports, NCC, NSS and the extra-curricular. This year too witnessed continuing Covid restrictions for major part of the academic year but despite the challenges that the pandemic threw at us, our faculty and students kept themselves actively engaged with academic pursuits. A few faculty members were invited as Resource Persons, some have delivered Keynote lecture, many have made presentations in international and national seminars and conferences, edited books and have richly contributed articles to various books, journals, and magazines. Several teachers participated in webinars, workshops, Faculty Development Programmes, and other researchoriented activities in online and offline mode. A number of promotions took place this academic year: 11 teachers were awarded Professorship, 11 promotions took place from Stage III to Stage IV, 21 teachers were promoted from Stage II to III and 17 promotions took place from Stage I to II. 2 promotions of the non-teaching staff took place in the Administration. 4 teachers successfully completed their Ph.D programme this year. The IQAC in association with the NSS and various Departments organized innumerable Talks, Webinars and other activities. NCC has brought many laurels to college and 8 of our cadets got recommended for

the Defence Forces. Our student has won a paper presentation award and a debating award. Our students have performed well in the university exams.

A lot of infrastructural expansion took place in college. The college canteen has recently undergone renovation. About 5-6 new rooms have been added for college use. We are in the process of acquiring new chairs for the classrooms and the Multipurpose Hall. The College is contemplating making a large hall, equipped with the latest technology, dedicated to academic and other activities. The Library, Administration and Accounts departments have been equipped with new computer systems for a smooth functioning of their works. The college has adopted RFID (Radio Frequency Intensive Device) which promises to provide seamless connectivity. As an energy-saving measure, the College has installed solar panels of approximately 200 KW. There is a plan in the pipeline to set up a new Computer Laboratory equipped with new and state of the art systems. New IP based CCTV cameras have been installed on college premises for better security. The College has entered into a partnership with Apar Enterprises, to impart education in the field of Digital Marketing. Revenue would be generated from this course which would be gainfully utilised for various college developmental activities. The College has taken an initiative towards promoting eco-friendly farming practices under the rubric Agri Tourism under able guidance of our honourable GB Member, Ms. Reva Sood.

I take this opportunity to commend my students, faculty members and the non-teaching staff for their tireless efforts at self-excellence and I wish them the best in their constant endeavor in making this institution bigger and better.

Commerce Department held a webinar on "Police Imaging: Changing Perspective of Police Among Public in India" by Mr Suvashis Choudhary, IPS officer on January 21. ### **Enactus**

Staying true to the core philosophy of uplifting the marginalized communities through the power of social entrepreneurship, Enactus DCAC worked on 2 projects this past year, namely Project Taaleem and Project Zaraat.

**Project Taaleem** aims to revolutionize the lives of the refugee children by imparting primary education through a community driven model where the teachers are identified from within the community itself. This year community libraries were set up in taaleem centers, which housed more than 3000+ books for the children. With Adani Foundation as financial partner to provide new furniture and 30 chairs were provided in our taaleem centers.

**Project Zaraat** is Enactus DCAC's latest project which aims to minimize post-harvest losses by equipping the farming community with affordable, portable and eco-friendly storage solutions. Zaraat further enhances the forward linkages and provides the farmers with an income boost by tying up with B2B organizations. Received mentorship sessions from Indian Agricultural Research Institute and Michigan State University. Established a composting set up. Currently working with 3 communities and looking into expanding into more communities via our collaboration with a Farmer Producer Organisation and innovate in the areas of organic farming, agro-processing etc. Organized the event Zaraat Mart to sell the farmer's produce directly to the consumers. This 2 day event proved extremely successful having sold more than 350 kgs of produce, generating a revenue of Rs 10000, and a profit of Rs.3000 for the farmers. Members of Enactus DCAC also participated in more than 15 Business Plan Competitions organized by colleges like IIT Roorkee, IIT Delhi, IIM Bodhgaya, CVS and won major positions along with prize money in the same.

The Project received an immense amount of grants and awards this year. It got a special mention in the Enactus Early-Stage National Competition 2021 held in August and is the recipient of the KPMG Business Ethics Grant 2021. Project Zaraat is awarded one of the top 4 projects globally in the Race to Feed the Planet and top 5 projects globally in the Race for Climate Action by Enactus. The Team will be presenting their project at the Enactus World Cup in Puerto Rico, USA this October 2022. Through their project they are successfully fulfilling 8 out of 17 UN SDGs and plan to sustain the project in the coming years to benefit our farmer beneficiaries. The Project has got media coverage by The Hindustan Times, Krishi Jagran and others and garnered applause from Mr. Anurag Kumar Singh, Deputy Manager at Agriculture Skill Council of India.

The Project has reduced post-harvest losses by a whopping 60%, minimized energy consumption by 20%, generated a revenue of more than 3.7 lakhs and directly impacted the lives of more than 250 farmers. It has now become a harbinger of hope for farming communities across 3 states.

### The College library

The Library has a massive collection of more than 60,711 books, 13 newspapers, 25 periodicals/magazines and approximately 500 CDs, which cater to all educational needs of faculty members, students, and staff. During the academic year 2021-2022 about 488 books were added to strengthen the library collection. The library is well equipped with all facilities and resources (print and electronic) such as books, journals, newspapers, online databases, question papers, syllabus, journalism projects, UPSC service material and book bank collections. A complete Stock Verification was carried out by the library.

### **E-resources provided by the Library:**

- Remote access of E-resources of DULS which provide access of millions of ebooks, e-journals and e-articles.
- N-LIST (subscribed by college) provide 6000+ e-journals and 164300 + e-books.

### Following services are provided by the Library:

- Reference/ Referral Service
- Borrowing of Books
- Internet Searches
- Web OPAC
- Current Awareness Service
- Plagiarism Check for faculty members of their research works through "URKUND" software
- Separate air-conditioned reading room for faculty and Students.
- The college library provides support services to visually impaired students by creating reading space along with system, Braille print material near the circulation.

### **Application of ICT:**

- The college library has shifted from existing software (Nettlib/Libware) to KOHA software (open-source software) on cloud server installation.
- The KOHA software facilitates remote access to data regarding college library holdings including book's location, book status, user membership transaction and email/notices to update the users.

### The support services, practices initiated and adopted:

- Google online forms were created to maintain the roster of students wanting to visit the library. They were given the facility to return the issued books and get new books issued.
- All faculty member and students were given user id and password to access eresources through the N-LIST program of INFLIBNET. It helps them access millions of e-books, e-journals and e-article while sitting at home.
- Various Google forms were created and uploaded on the college website under library section such as N-LIST memberships, Library Membership forms, Feedback Forms and Library visitor forms to help the users in accessioning the library and its various services.

Two cadets of DCAC NCC namely CDT Vikrant Dangi and CDT Yash Rathi were able to make it to the team of Delhi Directorate.

The TSC is a 12 days camp conducted by NCC in Delhi every year, in which the cadets are selected from all 17 directorates (30+3 cadets from each directorate), by the selection procedure conducting 3 Pre-TSC camps each of 10–12 days in a week's interval. The cadets from different states and regions participate in this camp. The selected cadets are sent to the TSC to represent their respective directorates. At first, the cadets are given a chance to participate in the obstacles and firing test in which the cadets should have good stamina and regular practice of push ups and running. Other competitions like Judging distance, Health and hygiene, Field signals, Map reading, Tent pitching, and Line area are also organized in the TSC camp, which is a good learning experience for the cadets. The cadets are able to gain a lot of knowledge, self-confidence, and leadership qualities.

### 9. EACH ONE, REACH ONE, TEACH ONE CAMPAIGN

DCAC NCC on the occasion of Teachers' Day which is held on 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022 took an initiative of conducting an Educational Drive under the campaign EACH ONE REACH ONE TEACH ONE being run by NCC. The cadets collaborated with NSS Tanzeal Project who gave them a chance to interact with their students and spend some quality moments with them. Various activities like teaching, dancing, speaking, painting and body exercises like PT and drill were organized by the NCC cadets for the children. The cadets got a chance to relive their childhood and also experience the responsibility of being a teacher at the same time.

# 10.<u>EK BHARAT SHRESHTH BHARAT CAMP – I (Delhi and Jammu & Kashmir & Ladakh Directorate)</u>

CDT Mukesh and CDT Aryaman Luthra of DCAC NCC participated in the EBSB CAMP (Delhi and J&K Directorate) from 3th October 2022 to 12th October 2022 conducted by 4 Delhi Girls Battalion NCC of HQ Group 'C' held at NCC Bhawan, Rohini New Delhi. The main objectives of the camp were to develop leadership skills, enhance knowledge and public speaking abilities, peer learning through mutual interactions, foster team spirit and, improve soft skills, understand culture of own state and the participating state of J&K and Ladakh

The duration of camp was 10 days starting from 11 October 2022 to 20 October 2022 . All the days were full of enjoyment and high josh. EBSB camp basically promotes integration of two Cultures. He got the chance to meet people from different regions of Jammu, Kashmir and Ladakh. They covered 14 to 15 kilometres daily and followed 5 different trekking routes during the camp. The cadets also got a chance to trek to Indo-Nepal Border. 
### (i) Practical








"Swachhata Pakhwada" as a part of "Swachhta Abhiyan" was initiated in

More than 90 volunteers participated in the drive and contributed in making the surroundings clean.















