



# भूमिका



# **EVOLUTION OF NEWS WRITING**

## NEHA JINGALA AND DEBASREE BASU

Mass communicators primarily hold the responsibility of informing, educating and entertaining the members of society. Using mass media, these communicators can set agenda for good governance of the society, preserve cultural heritage from one generation to another, and confer status on individuals or institutions in the society among other functions. In achieving all the above, different approaches like factual news reporting, feature writing, news analysis, editorial writing and news commentaries, among others are used by journalists.

### THE NEWSPAPER

The contents of a newspaper can be broadly classified into four types, namely news, features, advertisements, and opinion pieces.

- News may be defined as an accurate, unbiased account of the significant facts of a timely happening that is of interest to people.
- ii. Features are defined as newspaper/magazine articles or broadcast programmes devoted to the treatment of a particular topic, typically at length.
- iii. Advertisements are promotional campaigns that notify about a product; they even inform the readers about job vacancies, matrimonials, leases etc.
- iv. Opinion pieces such as editorials, columns, letters to the editor, and reviews are views expressed by people from within the organisation and outside.

## **News Determinants**

Reporters and editors make their decisions by weighing the *news value* of all the facts or stories available each day. Stories with greater news value for readers get written and those stories with greater news value than others are published in the paper. Several factors help to determine the news value of information. These are called *news determinants*. Although different journalists have slightly different lists, the items below are generally agreed upon.

i. Timeliness: News is perishable. It loses value as it ages.
Readers want to know now. What happened yesterday, last night, or this morning is more newsworthy than what happened last week. A new twist, angle, discovery, or disclosure, however,



# EVOLUTION AND ELEMENTS OF PRINT MEDIA: THE NEWSPAPER AND ITS RELEVANCE IN CONTEMPORARY TIMES

This essay aims to explore the history and development of print technology with special reference to the establishment of Johannes Gutenberg's printing press in the fifteenth century and the gradual dissemination of print culture in China, Japan and Korea. The study highlights the status of the Press in India during colonial and post-independent times and in the contemporary digital era.

# HISTORY OF PRINTING

The emergence and evolution of the printing press is an important part of our civilisation. Printing technology is considered to be an important means for the dissemination of information. In the year 1452, Johannes Gutenberg — a German goldsmith and printer — invented a movable type of printing press that launched a revolution in the printing world. It allowed mass production of printed works with the help of a simple mould and punch system. For almost 300 years, Gutenberg's printing press was the common equipment used for printing. As the number of printing presses grew, the production of books also mushroomed. The usage of the printing press increased the supply of printed materials, and reduced the cost, thereby leading to the possibility of mass production. The dissemination of printed material and easy accessibility to the reading material led to the creation of a new reading public.

Before the invention of the printing press, books were often made of vellum — a highly durable and expensive material. However, block printing is considered to be the earliest form of printing. In this process,



# Chapter 1 Climate Change, Its Impacts, and Sustainability Issues in the Indian Himalaya: An Introduction

Abstract Climate change poses threats to humans and brings the toughest challenges for economic development in the twenty-first century. The scientific communities warn the world leaders regarding the threats of climate change and its inevitable impacts on the physical and cultural environment. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) reported global warming of 1.5 °C which is a matter of great concern for all the stakeholders around the world. The manifestation of recent climate change is increasing flooding events, shrinking of the cryosphere (mass loss from ice sheets/glaciers, reductions in snow cover), vegetation changes, and loss of biodiversity which are having adverse effects on available resources and aesthetic/cultural aspects of the Indian Himalayas (IH). Hence, it is imperative to study the impacts and responses of the mountainous region towards climate change for sustainable planning and adaptability. This chapter aims to review the scientific works on emerging trends in climate change, its impacts, and sustainability issues in the IH. The review work suggests the need for more research on innovative ideas for better adaptation and to combat the increasingly adverse impacts of climate change.

# Marginalizations and Repressions in Vijaya Mehta's *Pestonjee* and *Hamidabai ki Kothi*

### Smita Banerjee


Vijaya Mehta (1934–) is a well-known name in the annals of Indian New Wave cinema and theatre. Baroda-born and Bombay University-graduate, she trained with the doyen of Indian theatre Ebrahim Alkazi (1925–2020). She is known for her contribution to the experimental and radical impulse in Marathi theatre of the 1960s. Her collaborations with playwrights such as Vijay Tendulkar (1928–2008) and Mahesh Elkunchwar, her production company Rangayan, are well-documented (Rajadhyaksha and Willemen 1995, p.146; Thoraval 2000, pp. 201–203). Her stint as Chairperson of NSD and NCPA¹ has cemented her place in the history of Indian theatre. She also acted in some of the well-known New Wave films such as Govind Nihalini's Party (1984) and Shyam Benegal's Kalyug (1981) as well as appearing in few of her directorial ventures such as Rao Saheb (1985), and Hamidabai ki Kothi (HBK, 1987). She has been described as one of the key women filmmakers from western India (Thoraval 2000) alongside Sai Paranjpye and Kalpana Lajmi. She has directed a total of seven films and

**Abstract** Urban centres are increasingly challenged by population increase and the resultant environmental concerns including the urban sprawl and climate change. Moreover, different patterns of urbanization contribute to the changing climate via differences in their urban metabolism represented by energy and matter. Urban metabolic studies in terms of energy and material inflows, outflows, and stocks can be associated with traditional evaluation techniques to help assess the magnitude and potential effects of variety of environmental challenges the world is facing today. Further, urban centres are critical real-time observatories that indicate the impact of anthropogenic activities on global biogeochemical cycles. For example, urban processes have significant and lasting impacts on the global carbon budget. It has also been observed that the technology and infrastructure advancements have fuelled increase in urban inputs and outputs of material and energy. Therefore, more sustainable approaches need to be adopted in changing scenarios for urban planning, particularly for sustainable resource utilization and better waste management practices. Taking a lead from the systematic review from 1990 to 2023, the chapter provides research trend analysis on urban metabolism in the backdrop of changing climate. It discusses the sustainability in urban metabolism, sustainable urban planning, ecosystem services, and disaster resilience so as to provide an interdisciplinary understanding of urban metabolism. The chapter identifies an urgent need to develop new methodological approaches for real-time and reliable evaluation of urban metabolism.
