# **RANK CEREMONY**


2022 - 23






# **INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY**

# **THAL SAINIK CAMP 2022**

AITSC is a prestigious camp of NCC in which cadets from all over India are tested in physical and mental ability skills through various competitions. The camp was held from 14th September 2022 to 25th September 2022 at DG National cadet corps. Two cadets of DCAC NCC namely **CDT Vikrant Dangi** and **CDT Yash Rathi** were able to make it to the team of Delhi Directorate.

The TSC is a 12 days camp conducted by NCC in Delhi every year, in which the cadets are selected from all 17 directorates (30+3 cadets from each directorate), by the selection procedure conducting 3 Pre-TSC camps each of 10–12 days in a week's interval. The cadets from different states and regions participate in this camp. The selected cadets are sent to the TSC to represent their respective directorates. At first, the cadets are given a chance to participate in the obstacles and firing test in which the cadets should have good stamina and regular practice of push ups and running. Other competitions like Judging distance, Health and hygiene, Field signals, Map reading, Tent pitching, and Line are are also organized in the TSC camp, which is a good learning experience for the cadets. The cadets are able to gain a lot of knowledge, self confidence, and leadership qualities.

DCAC was the nodal college for the academic year 2022-23 and We being convenor processed a total of 1,748 applications of JD NCC Cadets, who applied for admission under this category at the University of Delhi from all of India. This responsibility was assigned to us by the University of Delhi first time and we are happy to accomplish the same.





### EXAMINATION NCC CERTIFICATE "C"

NCC 'C' Certificate Examination was held on 18 February 2023 and 19 February 2023. The practical exam was conducted on 18th and written exam was conducted on 19th .

(i) Practical

15 NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce Attended the "C Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder. The examination was held at Cariappa Parade Ground Delhi Cant. At around 0845 hours, the investigating officer had an interaction with the cadets and gave his best wishes before the Commencement of the practical. Around 0900 hours the practical examination was started. First, the cadets moved on to 'Field Craft & Battle Craft and Communication'. In this section viva of all the cadets was conducted. Then, the cadets moved to 'Weapon Drill Test' where they started reporting to the officers and completed the Weapon Drill procedure along with viva. Once Weapon Drill Test was completed, cadets moved to 'Weapon Training' for 'Rifle Kholna Jhorna'. After the mantling and dismantling of SLR 7.62mm Rifle, viva of all the cadets was conducted based on topic of weapons and their characteristics. After that, cadets moved for Map Reading test. In the Map Reading test cadets were provided with a prismatic Compass, service protractor and the map to find the true north and grid system on the Map and then viva was conducted on the topic map reading of all the cadets.



#### (ii) Written Examination

15 NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce Attended the "C Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder. The examination was held at Cariappa Parade Ground Delhi Cant. At around 0930 hours the Invigilating Officer had an Interaction with the cadets, gave instructions regarding the exami-



nation and his best wishes to the cadets before the commencement of the examination. At 1030 hours the written examination commenced which ended at 1330 hours. Around 1400hrs Command-ing Officer gave his concluding speech by congratulating all the cadets.

Once Drill Test was completed, cadets moved to 'Weapon Training' for 'Rifle Kholna Jhorna'. After the mantling and dismantling of 0.22 MK IV Rifle, viva of all the cadets was conducted based on topic of weapons and their characteristics. After that, cadets moved for Map Reading test. In the Map Reading test cadets were provided with a prismatic Compass, service protractor and the map to find the true north and grid system on the Map and then viva was conducted on the topic map reading of all the cadets.



#### (ii) Written

NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce attended the "B Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder. The examination was held at Army Public School Dhaula Kuan. 


#### 15th-21st June 2022





100 students attended the seminar. It was an insightful session for all the attendees.








# 14th July 2022








#### 19th July 2022

#### ANNUAL REPORT 2022-2023

#### From the Principal's Desk

It is my great pleasure and pride to present before you the Annual Report of Delhi College of Arts & Commerce, University of Delhi, for the academic year 2022-2023. This Report provides an insight into the achievements of the students, teaching faculty and the non-teaching staff of the college for the academic year and sets a roadmap for our future goals. A perusal of the Report will highlight the contribution of all stakeholders maintaining a high standard of performance in the various activities that were conducted in the college.

Delhi College of Arts & Commerce was established in 1987. In the decade and a half since its inception it has established itself as a premier institution of the University of Delhi. Over the course of the years our students have excelled in various fields: academics, sports, NCC, NSS and the extra-curricular. In this academic year too our faculty and students have kept themselves actively engaged with academic pursuits. The various departments under the aegis of IQAC proudly hosted lectures, talks and webinars through the year. Many of our faculty members acted as Resource Persons, some have delivered Keynote lecture, many have made presentations in international and national seminars and conferences, edited books and have richly contributed articles to various books, journals, and magazines. Several teachers participated in webinars, workshops, Faculty Development Programmes, and other researchoriented activities in online and offline mode. Our faculty members' constant pursuit of excellence resulted in 7 professorships to be awarded this academic year. I am proud to announce that 58 permanent faculty appointments were made this year: 23 in the Commerce Department, 2 in Computer Science Department, 7in economics Department, 4 in English Department, 2 in EVS Department, 5 in Journalism Department, 2 in Mathematics Department, 9 in Political Science Department and 4 in Hindi Department. 4 faculty members successfully completed their Ph.D programme this year. The permanent position of the Librarian was filled. 5 promotions of the non-teaching staff took place in the Administration. The IQAC in association with the NSS and various Departments organized innumerable Talks, Webinars,

and other activities. Our students have performed well in the university exams. An MOU was signed, under which the well-tended college playground would not only boost sports activities but would also prove to be a revenue-generating resource for college. Our NCC cadets continued to bring laurels to college, SUO Tanmay Mittal got recommended by 22 Service Selection Board, Bhopal for becoming an officer in the Indian Army and CDT Rohit Roshan got selected as a General Duty Soldier in the Seema Suraksha Bal. Our rising sport star Yatish from English Honours has had the privilege of being trained under IPL and is enrolled in Under 19 Delhi Cricket team. Our students have presented research papers and won several competitive events. We entered into an MOU with Delhi University to set up a Career Development Centre in college to foster an ecosystem which would inculcate entrepreneurial values and self-reliance among students which would create job-givers rather than jobseekers in future.

A lot of infrastructural expansion took place in college. We have a state of art, soundproof Seminar Hall with smart projection facility and great acoustics. We boast of a newly refurbished college canteen which has been done with the proceeds of the successfully run Digital Marketing course. As an energy-saving measure, the College has installed solar panels. An upgradation of classroom furniture has taken place wherein we have procured lot of chairs and benches. Four smart displays have been installed in the committee rooms and seminar room, which will greatly enhance the teaching-learning experience in this digital age. Our students have won a paper presentation award and a debating award.

The library has added many new facilities /features this year. It is fully computerised and uses the library management software Koha on a cloud server to manage the housekeeping operation, acquisition, circulation, stock verification etc. It also provides a web based OPAC facility that is remotely accessible 24 hours a day.

I take this opportunity to commend my students, faculty members and the non-teaching staff for their tireless efforts at self-excellence and I wish them the best in their constant endeavour in making this institution bigger and better.

## Enactus

## **Active Project-ZARAAT**

- **Project Zaraat**, with an active team of 83 members aims to minimize post-harvest losses by providing an affordable, portable, and eco-friendly storage solution to small and marginal farmers. Post-Harvest losses amounting to 93,000 crores per year, refer to the losses taking place after harvesting but before final consumption, the primary cause of which is lack of proper storage and transportation facilities. This forces the farmers to practice distress selling and leads to a loss of bargaining power. Small and marginal farmers, who constitute close to 86% of the farmer base, bear the brunt of this problem.
- We have set up 6 Storage Solutions in our farming communities in the states of Delhi, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh.We aim to uplift the farming communities by our sustainable business model and we have reduced post-harvest losses by a whopping 60%, and minimized energy consumption by 20%. Generating a revenue of more than 2 lakhs and directly impacting the lives of more than 250 farmers, Zaraat has now become a harbinger of hope for farming communities across 3 states.
- We have collaborated with Indian Agricultural Research Institute and the agricultural Department of Michigan State University; they are our educational partners.
- Furthermore, we have been featured in various social media publications like Hindustan Times, Krishi Jagran, The Morning Standard, The Logical Indian, etc. and we have been honoured to receive Letters of Appreciation from civil servants and political personalities.
- Enactus DCAC reached the Semi Finalist stage in the Enactus India National Competition 2022. We also participated in the Global Sustainability Races- Race to Feed the Planet and Race for Climate Action. We were among the Top 4 teams in the Race to Feed the planet and Top 5 in Race for Climate Action. As a result of this, our team was invited to Puerto Rico, USA to represent our college and Team India. We presented our project on an international platform with a live audience from over 96 countries. Our Project Zaraat secured the Runners up position in Global Race to Feed the Planet and we won a cash prize of \$10,000 to further expand our project and create greater impact.
- Enactus DCAC won the Race for Better India 2022: SDG- Zero Hunger and received a cash prize of Rs.25,000.
- As a social initiative, Enactus DCAC launched 'Pratibha: Changing lives through Education' wherein we conducted book donation drives in collaboration with NGOs like Deepalaya and Goonj and donated over 1500 primary level books in education centers across Delhi.

• Enactus DCAC aims to set up solar dryers in our farming communities and further expand our project by setting up more storages and impacting even more lives of the farmers.

## **Career Development Centre**

#### **COLLEGE LIBRARY**

The college library has a rich collection of more than 61,819 books, 13 newspapers, 23 periodicals and magazines, and approximately 529 CDs, which provide the latest information and knowledge of various disciplines. During the academic year 2022-2023, about 1133 books were added to strengthen the library collection. The library is well equipped with all facilities and resources (print and electronic), such as books, journals, newspapers, online databases, question papers, a syllabus, a journalism project, UPSC service material, and book bank collections.

#### **E-resources:**

E- Resources facility is provided through DULS & N-LIST to its users to access the world's best databases, e-journals, e-books etc.

• Remote access to e-resources of DULS, which provide access to millions of e-books, e-journals, and e-articles

• The college library has renewed its membership in the N-LIST programme to access 6,000+ e-journals and 164300+ e-books. Library also provides online user ID and password to students and faculty members for having access to the N-List database.

#### **Circulation:**

The library recorded approximately 250–350 footfalls along with more than 12861 book circulation transactions through library open-source integrated library system software (KOHA)

#### Application of ICT, development and innovation work in the college library:

The library has added following new facilities /features in the year 2022-2023.

• The library is fully computerised and uses the library management software Koha on a cloud server. The library is introducing KOHA software to manage the housekeeping operation, acquisition, circulation, stock verification, and so on. It also provides a web-based OPAC facility that is remotely accessible 24 hours a day and provides a simple and clear interface for library users to perform tasks such as searching for and reserving items and suggesting new items. The KOHA software facilitates remote access to data regarding college library holdings, including their locations, book status, and user membership transactions.

• The entire library is under CCTV surveillance.

• Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) in the library is at the final stage, and the selfcirculation services through RFID will be started very shortly. RFID-based library management systems can automate shelf management. It is a more efficient way of identifying misplaced books in stock. It helps reduce the time taken for the stock verification process and also reduces the cost of inventory. It is faster than barcodes, and multiple books can be issued at a time. Borrowing and returning books can be fully automated with the help of self-check-in and check-out systems.

• The college library is introduced to DSpace (open-source software), which is used as an institutional repository. DSpace provides a way to manage research materials and publications in a professionally maintained repository to give them greater visibility and accessibility over time. DSpace is a platform that allows you to capture items in any format, including text, video, audio, and data.

The library created the following communities in DSpace for faculty and students to access the previous and current year syllabus, question papers, journalism project, their research articles, reports, and other activities/program of college through the following community Academic

• The library's webpage has been designed by the library and is accessible through the college website to raise awareness among students and faculty. It is the first and foremost place for a new patron to learn about the library, its resources, and its services. The library webpage contains online catalogues, electronic databases, subject resources, library instruction and tutorials, and digital collections. It offers their patrons high-quality material, typically in digital format, but their most significant function is to offer a wide range of enhanced library services.

• The library has implemented a QR code facility for their patrons / users to pay the fine online for overdue books.

• Various Google forms were created and uploaded on the college library webpage to help the patrons such as N-LIST memberships form, library membership form, feedback form, etc.

• The library conducted an Information Literacy Programme for students (I, II, and III years) and faculty members regarding the use of KOHA software by sharing a PPT through email in order to drive the benefits of the utilisation of KOHA software on cloud-based technology, which equips the platform with numerous distinctive, personalised features and 24-hour accessibility anywhere in the world.

• The college library has uploaded PPTs such as Information Literacy Programme KOHA Library Software, Use and Awareness about N-List E-Resources, Orientation PPT, Virtual Tour, etc.

• The library added 24 chairs and four long study tables for students to increase the seating capacity in the library

• The library also added five new computer systems (ACER) and one printer for the eresource room.

• A photocopy machine and two Almirah for library staff.

## Activities

• Library has organised a book exhibition during 30th and 31st January 2023 for student and faculty in which 14 prominent publishers and vendors participated. This exhibition gave more options to the faculty, staff, and students to purchase the books at a good discount and also facilitated acquisition of relevant books in the library.

• The college library also celebrated Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, the completion of 100 years of Delhi University, and the 150th birth anniversary of the great nationalist and philosopher Shri Aurobindo's collaboration with NBT India by organising a "Mobile Book Exhibition" on September 28, 2022, for the benefit of students and faculty of DCAC College.
