Counselling Centre

The Counselling Centre at Delhi college of Arts and Commerce provides personal and vocational guidance to the students of the college. Students go for counselling to get an unbiased, non-judgmental outlook to some of the current issues concerning them.

A. Orientation talks to the freshers.

- Orientation talks are given to freshers when they joined the College to familiarise them with the counselling facilities and dispel misconceptions so that they are encouraged to "ask for help".
- Group counselling sessions were arranged to make the students aware of the approach adopted during counseling.

B. Provide Personal and Vocational guidance.

- Personal counselling Sessions are conducted to help students resolve their problems. Students came up with myriad problems related to their personal life.
- Client centered sessions, on one-to-one basis are conducted using professional methods to provide strategy to help students resolve issues challenging them. Methodology used was Nondirective client Centered Therapy.

The counselling session usually last for one to one and a half hour. Repeat students require lesser time. Some students were counselled several times for various issues. These matters are highly confidential and to protect the student's identity, their names and numbers are not being shared to avoid a breach of trust with the students.

No of Students counselled:

July 2021- June 2022-Female 28, Male 19July 2022- June 2023-Female 20, Male 19

These numbers are excluding repetitive counselling sessions given to the abovementioned students. Staff members who contacted several times are not part of these figures. The average works out to approximately 0.41 fresh students per counselling hour.

The counsellor is available in the college on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 am to 11:00 am. Increase in timings to two hours per day is recommended from 9:00 am to 11:00 am on the same days.

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CHAPTER 1

AUDIT OBJECTIVES / METHODOLOGY



1.1 Preamble

Delhi College of Arts and Commerce (DCAC), a premier institution of higher learning, is a constituent college of the Delhi University, financed partially by the Govt. of NCT, Delhi. The College was established in 1987 under the aegis of the Delhi Administration once the erstwhile G.D. Salwan College closed its operation. Though it is now an entity independent of the Salwan Trust, yet in its formative years, it transformed out of the erstwhile G.D. Salwan College that was located in Rajinder Nagar.

DCAC has a campus area of approximately 5 acres, with a built-up area of around 2.5 acres. We also obtained Gender segregated data on the curriculum, male/female composition across various schools /departments as well as a listing of programs /workshops /Seminars conducted on Gender-related topics through another Google form issued to the management of the institute.





CHAPTER 2 OBSERVATIONS & FINDINGS



2.1 Observation and Findings

As per the methodology adopted, our observations & findings are presented for each specific Gender sensitive indicator identified for clarity and coverage of all independent & yet interlinked aspects of this Audit.

2.1.1 Curricular aspects

As stated in the preamble of this report, the college offers 18 undergraduate courses leading to the Bachelor with Honours/Programme Degree with various paper options for students to choose from both under the CBCS mode and the erstwhile semester/ FYUP mode. The college also offers various add-ons and self-financed courses.

Women empowerment /Gender equality is given prime importance in the college institute and the following courses are part of the regular curriculum for students as noted below

2.1.2 Teaching, Learning and Evaluation

As can be seen in the Gender Distribution Table-1 on the next page, female students are in equal numbers in the major streams of College ie B.A (Hons) English & B.A. (Hons) Journalism, while they have a sizeable number in other courses.

Further as can be seen in the same table there is a good presence of female faculty members & non-teaching staff, which is very encouraging. This is certainly an added heads-up advantage for the college to pursue women-centric policies and programmes

In line with the discussion with some of the faculty members & physical verification, it was observed that the following salient facilities including those related to Safety are in place keeping in mind the presence of sizable number of female students.

- Common rooms are provided for girls with adequate facilities including Sanitary pad vending machine (Fig-1)
- A large number of CCTV cameras (105 nos.) are installed at all the prominent locations & monitored at a central control room (Fig -2).
- The Medical room is in place with adequate signage & inventory for first aid
- Arrangement for both male and female security guards (24 x7) is made on the campus

As can be seen from Table 2 appended below, there is a large variation in the perception across the respondent categories on the adequacy of the available Infrastructure.

While most of the Faculty & the Non-teaching staff are satisfied with the resources & infrastructure, the student community s to demonstrate a lack of awareness especially relating to patrolling, hygiene, and non availability of safe spots for females as can be seen from responses in SI. no 2, 3 & 8 of Table 2)

A similar lack of awareness is observed from a large number of Students & members of the Teaching & non teaching staff to another set of survey questions relating to publications on Gender awareness as noted in SI no 1 of Table 3 below.

The overall satisfaction level among the Teaching faculty & Non-teaching staff on the adequacy of facilities, policies as well handling capabilities of the management is mixed, and therefore there is scope for enhancing the same to a much higher level within the student group

Based on the response noted in Tables 2 & 3, it is clear that there is a definite scope for improvement and accordingly our recommendations are presented in Chapter 3.

It may be noted that a large percentage have responded to suggest increased focus through debates, seminars, street plays, regular communication, newsletter, self-defence class, seminars etc.




Fig 3- Respondent suggestion for Enhancing Overall Awareness




Fig 4- Respondent suggestion for Enhancing Gender Sensitivity




Fig 5- Respondent distribution on co-curricular activities

2.1.6 Organization and Management

a) Relating to Women's empowerment & Gender sensitization

Realizing the importance of creating awareness on Women empowerment & fostering a sense of Gender equality in young minds right from an early stage of their adulthood, the college has institutionalized following forums /cells in order to sensitize the students on these aspects alongside their academic pursuit

> Women's Cell and Gender Sensitization Committee

DCAC has an active Women's cell that works for the welfare of the women students, facilitates redressal of their grievances and organizes regular talks on women-related issues.

This cell usually undertakes its activities in collaboration with the Girl's Common Room as well as the Internal Complaints Committee of the college. Under the aegis of this cell, a Sanitary Napkins vending machine has also been installed in the college in the girl's common room. Besides this, these napkins are also available with the medical room nurse to safeguard against any mechanical fault of the vending machine

The Women's Cell in collaboration with the Girls Common Room, Gender Sensitisation Committee and the Internal Complaints Committee organizes various activities from time to time.

Some of the prominent areas where the cell has been active are organizing film screenings, talks and interactive sessions on issues like domestic violence and sexual harassment at the workplace, statutory provisions related to sexual harassment and their prevention in the college, gender sensitization and need for attitudinal change, female foeticide and the like. Self-defense workshops as organized by Delhi Police Crime Cell are also being organised in the college.

b) Relating to the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH)

As an institution of higher education engaged in teaching, research and promotion of knowledge, the College takes its responsibility in sensitizing its students about all forms of discrimination and harassment, especially sexual harassment on the College campus.

Whereas sexual harassment results in a violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under Article 21 of the Constitution and her right to practice any profession or to carry any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment.

By the act of the Parliament, which received the assent of the President on 22nd April 2013 The Sexual Harassment of Women at Work Place (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 (No.140f 2013)



was enacted /published and the process of inquiry will follow the rules and regulations of article 5(d) of this act.

A copy of the aforesaid Act is available in the staffroom, Administrative Office, Accounts Office, Library, Principals' Office and Girls Common Room, for knowledge and consultation

An Internal complaint committee is formed and the names of the member are listed on the website. Information relating to its members, and preventive and redressal mechanism for sexual harassment is prominently displayed in the college. See Figure 3

Any woman aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach the presiding officer or any other members of the internal complaints committee against sexual harassment

Further, a Special Cell has also been set up to deal with matters related to gender-based violence & the member list is displayed on the college website with their contact details. A complaint box is placed outside the Principal's office to register a complaint.

c) Relating to non-discriminatory procedure and policies for recruitment, promotion and placement in senior management position

Non-discriminatory procedures & policies are certainly in place given the fact almost equal no of women professors got promotions to reach the highest possible designation in the College & at the same time they are also successfully spearheading other co-curricular and administrative activities.

The significantly large number of women faculty members as noted in earlier sections shows that the recruitment procedure is unbiased on Gender discrimination, which is an appreciable situation.

2.1.7 Healthy Practices

The college has organised several events as part of the healthy practice to impart awareness on continual basis on Women empowerment, safety, and challenges in collaboration with leading experts in the related field.

Some of the events are listed below & a more detailed report is appended in Section 4.5 of Chapter 4-Annexure

- Internal Complaints Committee in collaboration with VANGATI, Commerce Association and IQAC organized a webinar by Dr, Rajuben L. Desai, member of the National Commission for Women on 'Sexual Harassment at Workplace' on 17 August 2021
- The lecture on "Comparative analysis of feminity with special reference to Japan" by Mr. Dalel Singh, former Director of India Trade Promotion Organization was delivered on 10 September 2021
- An Online Orientation program was held on 30 November on "Sexual Harassment in College and Gender Sensitive Issues and Challenges " by Advocate Sunil Kumar Chaturvedi.
- On the occasion of International Women's Day on 8 March 2022 an Intra college Poetry and Poster making competition was held on themes: women's harassment, empowerment, safety, leadership and changing roles of women.
- A lecture by Dr Sudha Singh on women's empowerment was organized on 11 March 2022.

However, referring to Table 5 below, it is noted that there is a mixed perception among the respondents on the Survey question relating to healthy practices of conducting regular events on Gender sensitive issues, especially those of the Students, who felt that something more has to be done.



The reported low perception can be improved by focusing on the suggestion presented in Figures 3 to 5 in the earlier section 2.1.4 of this report




3. Whether there is a published policy to deal with sexual harassment complaints if any?






5. Are you aware if there is a written down procedure for handling such complaints?


6. Is it easy to approach the committee for complaint redressal?






7. Whether induction/ orientation programs are held to explain the policy and methods?


9. Whether CCTV cameras are provided on the campus?






10. Whether female security guards are available on the campus?

11. Is there any patrolling squad in and around the campus?









12. Whether helpline numbers are clearly dispalyed at various places in the campus?




14. Whether lectures/ seminars/ webinars are conducted on gender sensitive issues?
