The ten members, heads body looks after the progress and scalability of projects catering to improve the lives of people from various backgrounds **PROJECT VIKALP**, where we provide the women from a community in Tilak Nagar a huge market and outreach through our collaboration with 'WH Smith'; which were sparkled with a lot of Project Vikalp tote bags sewed by the women in Tilak Nagar.

## **PROEJCT CANSURVIVE**

Another of our project was Project CanSurvive, which brought smiles on the faces of a numerous breast cancer-stricken lives. Here in collaboration with the NGO, Win over Cancer we provided 'prosthetic bras' at a very minimal rates to all the patients of breast cancer. **PROJECT ADARSH GRAM** The last project we successfully sustained was Project Adarsh-Gram wherein we identified a village along the borders of Delhi, 'Khampur'. This village located along the vast industrial area of Naraina was in dire need of some entrepreneurial initiatives that could turn the tides by utilizing the various resources of the village and in turn extracting funds for the residents of the village. We did this, by taking our social entrepreneurial approach that could do the same by ensuring that the ownership remained within the community itself. We successfully installed a water filter, waste management system, an all-inclusive Ashram inside the village. We thus managed to make the village waste free and ensured the availability of clean and safe drinking water for the residents.

#### **PROJECT KAUSHAL**

Pradhan Mantri Kaushal VikasYojana. An initiative that had the targets of achieving magnanimous results through skilling provided by certain private agents which would be funded by the govt. This project operates through four of our existing centers in the village of Bhatti (near Chhatarpur), Khampur, Sarai (Faridabad) and Jaunty. We moved on to collaborate with private skilling corporations like Primero training, Mysha Skills Academy, Maruti Suzuki, Social Action Foundation. One of the major developments of the project would be our initiative in Jammu & Kashmir, wherein our team went through the Indian Army that spotted the need of a similar project in the Reasi district of J&K and thus offered a helping hand in the initiation of the services. Our team went on to organize some mass mobilization events and offered the knowledge of the initiatives that were being started and performed for them by the govt. **PROJECT ADHIKAAR** which aims at empowering women belonging to socially backward society through the help E-rickshaws by bringing the manufactures and micro-financers under one roof. This year Enactus DCAC in collaboration with **GMR under its CSR initiative, has brought Erickshaws to more women while targeting the areas of mundka, Mahipalpur and Dwarka**. Various sets of field visits to **NGOs like hands for help, Pradhishta,Action India, slum dwellers association** has helped us reaching the dream of having 10 drivers on road and more such in pipeline. This year project Adhikaar, reached new heights after it was represented at **an international stage, i. e., the Hults business plan which took place in Dubai.** The business plan was an initiative of the Bill Clinton foundation and out team was the **only team that represented the entire circuit of Delhi University.** To further facilitate our initiatives the projects have received grants from companies such as **Walmart and Blue Dart** in different categories.
