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
#### **Cleanliness drives for Statues**

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#### **Swacch Bharat Drive**

DCAC NCC unit organized a sanitation drive from 1 October to 4 October 2019 where cadets spread awareness to sensitize the citizens about safe sanitary practices and solid-liquid waste management. Given the challenges being faced in the area of water sanitation and hygiene especially in our nearby areas, the engagement of NCC cadets in program in a spirited manner has enabled us to bring alive the idea of a clean India. 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

On 2nd October, 2022 Prakriti collaborated with TINEB "There is no Earth-B" and organised a clean-up drive in the Ridge Forest situated in Karol Bagh, Delhi. It was organized on the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi an environmentalist and who dedicated his life to spread the message and practice of cleanliness by everyone. The clean-up drive lasted for several hours during which Prakriti members collected all kinds of non-biodegradable materials such as plastic, glass, synthetic fibres etc. The waste was then collected at one place to be measured by a weighing scale. # 48kg waste cleared from Yamuna bank

New Delhi: A group of volunteers collected and segregated 48 kg waste from the Yamuna bank on Friday. The group called 'There is no Earth B' claims to have cleared about 18 tonnes of non-biodegradable waste from different parts of Delhi in the past three years. It has conducted 322 clean-up drives in the city so far, said one of the volunteers

The group, which has mem-bers from diverse fields, including doctors, engineers, stu-dents and retired people, and different age groups, organised the clean-up drive in association with Delhi College of Art and Commerce (DCAC) and collected 48 kg non-biodegradable waste, "Before the pandemic, we used to organise three-four such clean-up drives in a week, but now, we are doing just two per week. Tejaswi Singh, a student of DCAC, said, "The act of cleaning the Yamuna bank was insignificant in general owing to the amount of waste that is thrown into the river. But we are happy that we could do at least something about it."



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## 3.1.iv Project TanZeal

Aiming to improve the knowledge and impart education to underprivileged kids.

Two students from DCAC, Sukriti Sethi and Yashovardhan Verma and felt that there was a lacuna in the education that students from economically strained sections were receiving. The students saw slum children playing in the slums where Hotel Leela has now come up. These were children of migrant labourers. Sukriti and Yash started talking with these children and realised that they too had dreams and were keen to learn. This gave them the idea to do something for them. They decided to start taking some classes with them in the college premises. One of their friends Tanzeel, passed away while on holiday. So they decided to name their endeavour TanZeal in his memory. They started TanZeal with 4 students from the neighborhood in 2012. Today there are over 100 students who come regularly. Student volunteers take classes with these students regularly.

In Project TanZeal the underprivileged children come to the centre five days a week from 2:30 to 4:30. Student volunteers take classes with these students on many subjects. Some of the subjects they give mentoring on include: Mathematics, English and Hindi. The student volunteers go beyond merely academic teaching and also focus on the moral and personality development of their students. To facilitate their holistic development student volunteers also encourage the students to participate in extra-curricular activities and hone their skills in dancing, singing and art talent once a week. The student volunteers noticed a marked improvement in their performance in their respective schools. The volunteers also take students on regular outings to explore new places in Delhi. This expands their horizon and awareness. They were taken on a Metro ride, for a picnic to Safdarjung's Tomb. The children were taken to visit Nehru Planetarium. Prior to this outing, the children were told about the stars, the various constellations, the planets, and the solar system. They greatly enjoyed their outing which enhanced their understanding of the night sky.

The greatest evidence of success has been the improved performance of students in their respective schools. In fact, after the very first year of operations, the teachers of neighbouring schools were asking where their students were going since there was a marked improvement in their performance in school. Furthermore, students also give a live performance during the Annual NSS Mela, AADYA, held in the college premises. During this performance, they showcase their talents and also what they have learnt during the year. Students also display and sell bookmarks, diyas etc. they make in their art classes during the festival. The money generated is used for purchasing more stationery products for the children every year.

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## 3.1.vi Project Vikalp

Started in 2013, this project tries to showcase the blend of traditional female art with the modern interests of today's women who dream of travelling and working toe to toe with men.

#### **SOLUTION**

The different kinds of bags stitched by these women are then sold through various e-commerce sites, stall set-ups, and retail chains. Pilot entrepreneurs of the project from Deepalya in Tilak Nagar, have been organized into a self-help group named 'Sankalp' to carry out their functions smoothly, and are also trained in basic mathematics, spoken English, and financial literacy. They have also been taught to use intricate equipment like zuki machines for better quality and efficiency. Project Vikalp's biggest achievement has been a collaboration with the multinational company WH Smith, where a huge number of bags are marketed and sold through regular orders. A production unit has also been set up with these women, who with the help of various skill development trainings run it in a self-sufficient manner.

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### 3.1.vii Project Kaushal

Pioneering an innovative community-driven model of a Skill Incubation Centre, where an entrepreneur mobilises people from the community to Skill Development Centres under PMKVY, in exchange for a mobilisation fee.

- 1. The Skill Incubation Centre is set up in an area of high unemployment & is managed by a member of the community who has a good hold over the same while having entrepreneurial ambitions.
- 2. The entrepreneur at our centre receives a mobilization fee for every person he mobilises to our partner SDCs, which is approximately Rs.500-1,000 per person.
- 3. Besides that, to tackle the rural-urban divide in access to technology, we use refurbished computers to provide e-services at the centre and digital literacy classes to the youth.
- 4. All of these services combined enable our entrepreneur to earn a sustainable income of more than Rs.18,000 every month.

### **SUSTAINABILITY**

The project was rolled out in Village Khampur located on GT Karnal Road in 2016, expanding rapidly to parts of Delhi- NCR such as Faridabad, Baljeet Nagar, Bhatti mines while also furthering its footprint in parts of states such as Jammu & Kashmir, Rajasthan & Uttar Pradesh.





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## 3.1.viii Project Adhikaar

Adhikaar aims to empower women towards a sustainable livelihood, breaking gender stereotypes, and resolving the pressing issues of last-mile connectivity and women harassment by pioneering a non-polluting women-driven commutation service.

#### THE NEED

- 1. Rising number of women harassment cases in Delhi, most of them taking place in the commutation sector, resulting in low female labour force participation.
- 2. Public transportation fails to satisfy the commutation needs of the masses due to a lack of a safe, affordable & accessible mode of last-mile commute.
- 3. The air quality index in Delhi has degraded to 30 times below the standard levels of the World Health Organisation, presenting an alarming and grim situation.

#### SOLUTION

Adhikaar is a one-stop shop for all e-vehicle needs, accommodating numerous manufacturers, micro-financers & trainers to help women become the drivers of change. The project was envisioned to give women the freedom to choose between numerous e-vehicle manufacturers and microfinanciers, assisting them to step into the commutation sector with e-rickshaws and e-bikes, while solving the problems of last mile commute, poor air quality & the rising cases of women harassment in the last mile commute, all in one go.

#### **SUSTAINABILITY**

The pilot began initially in Trilokpuri, a riot-affected region in Delhi, with the movement gradually spreading its wings to Govindpuri & Mundka in 2016-18. To ensure the venture is sustainable, we organized our e-rickshaw drivers into an 'Adhikaar trust', which will ultimately look after the procurement of their fellow counterparts, while also ensuring high scalability using a 'train-the-trainee' model.

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### 3.1.ix Project Saahas

Project Saahas is an umbrella project which aims to provide end to end support to breast cancer survivors. Initially started with a vision to reduce taboo regarding breast cancer, it has now deepened its roots by successfully commercializing a unique cotton-based breast prosthesis.

#### **NEED**

- 1. Early detection is quite essential in the treatment of breast cancer but it is still considered to be a taboo.
- 2. 70% of the breast cancer cases in India are diagnosed in the 3rd or 4th stage necessitating a breast removal surgery or a mastectomy.
- 3. With 1,65,000 cases every year, the number is all set to double by 2030.

## **SOLUTION**

- To solve this budding crisis, we have fabricated a patented cotton-based prosthesis made of recyclable cotton, sold under the brand name Canfem, and is AIIMS-approved, making it ideal for cancer survivors.
- Our prosthesis is a better alternative than Foam-based and Silicone-based prosthesis, as they do not cater to the problems of chronic backache, body weight imbalances, uneven drop in shoulders, and random chest pain and are not budget-friendly.
- We've also diversified further into comfortable, seamless, and affordable mastectomy brassiere for breast cancer patients.







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## 3.1.x Project Taleem

Revolutionizing refugee education through a unique community-driven model that engages children with the help of active story-based learning.

#### THE NEED

- 1. The primary school enrolment rate of refugees is a mere 61% comparing it with 95% globally.
- 2. Private schools are inaccessible due to high costs and lack of infrastructure.
- 3. Unqualified teachers and outdated methods of teaching don't act as a pull factor for the refugee children.

### THE SOLUTION

Taaleem pioneers refugee children as the changemakers in society, removing them from the stereotypes and making them a positive force for India. We, at Taaleem firmly believe that engaging parents, in their children's education is the key to solving India's illiteracy problems.

- Project Taaleem is a lightweight cloud-based solution that helps illiterate parents read stories to their children for the first time. This is the process of ABSL (Active Story-Based Learning). It simplifies complex concepts by generating engaging content.
- Storytelling takes the center stage in our solution, which is fundamental to the Early Childhood Development & over time, studies have shown that it is crucial to developing Language, Creativity, Logic & Curiosity.

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## 3.1.xi Project Zaraat

Project Zaraat, the flagship project of Enactus DCAC, aims to minimize post-harvest losses and uplift the farming community by enhancing forward linkages through a self-sustaining social enterprise.

#### **CHALLENGES**

- India registers Post-harvest losses equal to 40% of India's total major agricultural produce which amounts to a staggering figure of 92,651 crores.
- Despite being the second-largest producer of fruits and vegetables, India ranks as low as 101st on the Global Hunger Index (2021).
- There exists an approximate gap of 84-99% in the availability of storage and transportation infrastructure in India. Additionally, existing storage solutions are expensive, inaccessible, and non-eco-friendly.
- Small and marginal farmers which constitute 86% of the entire farming base in the country encounter problems of distress selling and loss of bargaining power at the hands of the middlemen.

#### **NEED ASSESSMENT**

To better understand the plight of this community, we assessed the current alternatives available to the farmers, and found that India oversees a gap of 84-99% in achieving the target of improving its storage facilities. Out of the ones that do exist, 75% store only potatoes. Our market analysis led us to conclude that the current storage alternatives are expensive, inaccessible, and not environmentally friendly.

#### SOLUTION

- Identifying a market need for an ecofriendly and portable storage solution, we innovated Project Zaraat!
- In partnership with SaptKrishi, we introduced a solar-powered portable storage with a 300kg capacity that maintains freshness and slows the ripening process.
- The solution requires 10 watts of electricity generated by solar power. At the same time, the battery attached ensures a one-day backup, reducing energy consumption by over 80%.
- The storage uses evaporative cooling and requires 2 liters of water per week. This environment-friendly innovation essentially creates a microclimate inside the storage, increasing the shelf life of the produce by 15 days.
- Besides this, we have sustained our previous collaboration with Tan90, another storage solution that also works on the same principle.
- This enabled the farmers to fully utilize their potential bargaining power and increase their profit margins.

















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#### MARKET LINKAGES and COLLABORATIONS

- We further analyzed various distribution channels and conducted successful meetings
  with B2B companies such as Crofarm, and Zomato Hyperpure, and restaurant chains
  like Pind Baluchi, citing payment security, an average rise in income of 15-20%, and
  consistent demand.
- We have collaborated with **Bijak** wherein we have integrated our farmers into an Online Agri Commodity Trade platform.
- Moreover, we found that crop residue was of no use to the farmers and was being burnt
  as a result. To tackle this problem, we have set up composting bins in collaboration
  with Rise Foundation. The compost thus produced will help boost production and
  substitute the use of fertilizers.
- To monitor the data of our diverse beneficiaries, we have conducted digital profiling in association with **Samunnati**, **India's largest agri-tech enterprise**.
- Realizing that crop productivity is inadvertently based on soil health, we leveraged the invaluable experience of our channel partner **Kisaan Helpline** by conducting **soil testing** in its accredited laboratory, testing soil quality on 14 parameters.
- Witnessing the global shift towards digital agriculture gave rise to the idea of **Zaraat portal**, a one-stop solution for the farmers to easily access our very own curated database of resources allowing them to purchase agricultural inputs at a cheaper rate.
- Seeing our zeal and passion for social entrepreneurship, **Adani Foundation** agreed to serve as our financial partner, helping Zaraat reach greater heights.



#### ZARAAT MART

To venture into the B2C model, we organized Zaraat Mart to sell the farmer's produce directly to the consumers. This 2 day event proved extremely successful having sold more than 350 kgs of produce, generating a revenue of Rs 10000, and a profit of Rs.3000 for the farmers.







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# **SUSTAINABILITY**

To ensure the project's sustainability, our farmer entrepreneur will evolve as the overseer of the project allowing them to manage and own the storage, after recouping our investment. Staying true to our aim, we have:

Reduced post-harvest losses by a whopping **60%.** 

Minimized energy consumption by **20%.** 

Generating a revenue of more than **3.7 lakhs.** 

Directly impacting the lives of more than **250 farmers**.

Zaraat is now functional in communities across 3 states.

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#### 3.1.xii Project Riayat

#### **NEED**

- In India, individuals with physical disabilities are often ostracised from society and their hardships are overlooked.
- A staggering 30 million people confront the formidable challenge of physical disabilities. Among them, 44.7% face locomotor disabilities, which not only hinder movement but also impact self-expression, independence, and self-esteem, leading to severe mental health conditions.
- Such individuals encounter various challenges in dressing, which hinder their mobility, motion, and dexterity. From the frustration of removing prosthetic limbs to the struggle of wheelchair users in donning lower garments, these obstacles deeply affect their lives and livelihoods.

#### **SOLUTION**

Enactus DCAC conceived Project Riayat to address this concern. Riayat endeavors to empower specially-abled individuals by providing affordable adaptive clothing solutions, creating employment opportunities, and reducing the reliance on caregivers for an enriched daily living experience. Simultaneously, it tackles the issue of surplus textile waste through a self-sustaining social enterprise.

#### ADAPTIVE CLOTHING

- These clothing are specially designed for individuals with physical limitations, aiming to simplify dressing and undressing while countering social stigmas and stereotypes.
- Designed innovatively to resemble normal clothing from the outside, they
  feature hidden Velcro or magnetic closures, easy-to-use zippers, tear-away
  sleeves, and front or side openings, ensuring smooth dressing experiences with
  utmost comfort and convenience.







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Riayat actively organises sensitization camps to raise awareness and educate participants about the issues faced by persons with disabilities, fostering understanding and empathy within communities. The Riayat portal offers mental health counselling sessions, an online community for individuals with special needs, promoting a positive body image and improving psychological and emotional well-being.

#### **PROJECT MODEL**

Furthermore, with a five-step business model from community identification to setting up production units, market linkages, and imparting skill training and entrepreneur creation, it works towards the goal of a sustainable social enterprise, transforming these individuals into independent taxpayers rather than dole recipients.

Offering a unique selling point, the adaptive clothing is affordable and customisable with the aim to enhance the accessibility of traditional Indian wear for individuals with disabilities, fostering inclusivity and broader participation in cultural and social gatherings. Project Riayat also seeks to address the challenge of constraints in retail channels and limited variety, by the establishing special market linkages reducing the economic infeasibility and inaccessibility of adaptive clothing in India. This distinguishes Riayat from other competitors and establishes it as a market-leader.











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As it looks ahead, the project is poised to expand its reach and make an even greater impact on communities across India. With a steadfast commitment to making life better for everyone, Project Riayat exemplifies the power of empathy, innovation, and inclusivity in creating a more equitable society. As it continues its journey, the project remains a shining example of positive change in action.

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#### 3.6 Proof of National Service Scheme (NSS) activities

#### From College Annual Report 2018-2023

The National Service Scheme Unit of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce witnessed a year bubbling with activities. The unit saw a number of fresh volunteers join the team in the new session and organized a number of events; mandated and project wise.

#### **NSS**

NSS unit of the college enrolled hundred volunteers and under took several activities to actualize the NSS motive of "Not me but You". Many activities were undertaken as per the directives of Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports. In celebrating 150 year of Mahatma Gandhiji"s birth anniversary several activities were held, connecting with the message of "Clean and Green India." Five ongoing projects continued enabling students to cultivate leadership qualities.

On 21 June 2018 the **Fourth International Yoga Day** was celebrated in the college auditorium. The commencement of admission for the academic session 2018 saw active involvement of volunteers .The Help Desk with ten volunteers during admissions addressed queries of new comers and their parents.

Under **project Swachh Bharat Summer Internship** of Ministry of Ministry of Water and Sanitation HRD and Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports six interns namely Eesha Shonak, Ajay Kumar, Yash Kirar, Gitika, Parneet and Riya Kumari worked in village of Ajadpur in July. The main activities revolved around issues of sanitation, drinking water, cleanliness, tree plantation and education. Each intern devoted hundred hour and they were successful in informing inhabitants and used the local park for wall paintings and plantation. In the local school they interacted with students and had many interactive sessions with them.

The **Swachhta Pakwada** was observed in the month of August 2018. On 1August Swachhta Pledge was taken. From 6 to 8 August awareness campaign was carried out in the RDO complex, adopted slum. Each household was contacted. Posters were put up. The College campus was also cleaned. On 13 August cleaning of Safdarjung Tomb was undertaken after obtaining permission of ASI. An interactive session was also held to devise modalities to ensure clean campus and public spaces.

The **Orientation Programme** was held on 6 September 2018. It was graced by Dr Veerendra Mishra, Director NSS Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and S.P.Bhatnager. Dr Mishra mapped the history and motivation of NSS. Dr Bhatnagar also informed students about the activities undertaken by volunteers. Thereafter Project leaders showcased work done by NSS in 2017-18. All NSS volunteers attended the programme.

The **NSS day** was celebrated by organizing several activities. It was devoted to the theme of "Swachhta Hi Seva". To mark the day, wall painting of Mahatma Gandhiji was Made. A slogan writing and painting competition was also held. The work undertaken by the unit was



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displayed on the notice board through pictures. These activities were attended by seventy volunteers. A few students also attended the programme in JNU.

The **Vigilance Awareness Week** was observed from 29 October 2018 to 3 November 2018. An Integrity pledge was taken by academics, students and administrative staff. Kartikeya Yadav, Gayatri Khuranna and Vidushi Arora participated in the Quiz held in the Dyal Singh College. They won the third award and were presented with the shield.

**The Unity Day** was observed on 31 October to mark the birthday of Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel. Homage was also paid to our freedom fighters. A Unity Oath was taken and participants resolved to follow the path shown by Iron Man of India.

In accordance with directives received from the office of Election Commission, Puneet Kumar Khankhodiya was appointed the SVEEP Ambassador. He attended orientation programme. Along with his volunteers he carried on the awareness drive for first time voters. The details about unregistered voters were collected and sent to the office of Election Commission. On 16 April 2019 workshop was held wherein mock hands-on experience was given to students in usage of EVMS and VVPATI.

The most awaited **annual festival Aadya** was celebrated on 16 January 2019. There was participation of several NGOs. Various competitions were held to mark the day and saw participation of many colleges. There were dance performances by students of Tanzeal.

**Two Blood donation camps** were held with the assistance Indian Red Cross Society and Roctrac.

The havoes caused by floods in Kerala saw an initiative undertaken by NSS volunteers to start a relief fund. More than 120 kilograms of ration was purchased with the collected money and was sent to GOONJ for transportation to Kerala.

The work undertaken by each Project was noteworthy. Under project Tanzeal, students teach 120 students from neighbouring slum on the campus on weekdays. A holistic teaching module has been prepared to take care of mental and physical needs of students. Through help desk old books were collected in accordance with needs of students. All important national days and festivals are celebrated with them. Thus Independence Day, Rakhi, Hoil and Diwali was celebrated. Students were also taken for picnic to Bal Bhavan. They also occupied centre stage in the Adya. Sports Day scheduled on 18 April saw a large participation. Those who had excelled in academics and were winners in various competitions were given prizes.

The Project Arts and Crafts remained can integral part of all activities of NSS. Through making of e-posters to artifacts"s, from wall paintings to decorative items, the project provided visual meanings to ethos of NSS. Mention may be made of a wall painting made on women empowerment in a competition held by the University of Delhi on 26 October 2016. In the college campus three paintings of character called Bean were drawn. Under project Sensitization several workshops were held. The workshop on the issues revolving around LGBTQ was conducted by Ms Pavel of Nazariya. The most important work under



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project Specially Abled is to provide scribes for visually impaired students. It is with coordinated National Association of Blinds. The project Clean and Green is responsible for upkeep of campus and RDO complex. It has undertaken a plantation drive on the campus. The work done by volunteers was appreciated on 16 April 2019 at the NSS Annual Day.

#### **NSS**

The NSS, constituted under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, has nearly eighty volunteers. The motto NSS, "Not Me But You", is the corner stone in all community service activities. This year NSS carried out five in-house projects. In addition to these, directives received from various government institutions and MYAS were implemented. This year marks the 50th anniversary of the foundation of NSS. The ideals of Mahatma Gandhi were remembered and implanted. The major activities of the NSS are listed below:

**Fifth International Day of Yoga**: was observed in the college on 21 June, 2019. Volunteers also participated in a meeting organized at Gandhi Bhavan by the coordinator NSS, University of Delhi.

**Admission Help Desk**: every day, during June and July, ten NSS volunteers each assisted admission seekers to the college.



**Blood Donation Camp**: was organized in association with Red Cross in August to celebrate Indian independence.

**Swachhta Pakhwada**: was observed from August 1, 2019 to August 15, 2019. The following activities were undertaken:

- A graffiti of Mahatma Gandhi was made on the wall of campus.
- A water conservation drive was carried out in ARD complex.
- Students studying under project Tanzeal were sensitised about the importance of cleanliness.



**Orientation Programme**: was held on 5 September, 2019 in the college auditorium. The programme officer appraised new volunteers about the activities of the previous year so that they could select their own projects and activities judiciously.

Celebration of 50 year of foundation of NSS: Several activities marked this day. The NSS board showcased journey of NSS in the college. Cleanliness drive was organized. The need to ban plastic was underlined through awareness campaign. Poster making activity was organized with the students of Tanzeal.

**Workshop on E Waste**: was organised by NSS and Prakriti, and conducted in association with the NGO Sharp, on October 21, 2019. The need to reduce and dispose e-waste properly was underlined in this interactive workshop.

**Vigilance Week:** was observed in October 2019. Volunteers, and others present, were administered oaths to a vow of bribery all forms. An interactive session was also organized during this week.

**Unity Day**: The birth anniversary of Sardar Patel was celebrated on October 31, 2019 as Unity Day. Dr Amrit Kaur Basra PO outlined the life journey and contribution of the Iron Man of India in the making of Modern India. Unity Day oath was administered to volunteers, faculty and non-teaching staff.

**Constitution Day**: was celebrated in the college on November 26, 2019. The participants read the Preamble to the Constitution. An oath was administered and all participants renewed their commitment to work for the goal of One Nation One People. They also watched the live broadcast of the joint-session of Parliament.

**Diwali Celebrations**: students of Tanzeal celebrated an eco-friendly Diwali. During the celebrations diyas and rangoli were made. Later the diyas were lighted and refreshments served to all the participants.

**Tanzeal Trip**: in November, 2019 the annual trip for students of Tanzeal to Nehru Planetarium, Teen Murti was organised. The students also visited Nehru Memorial and participated in several activities.

Spread the Warmth: NSS volunteers collected and donated blankets to the needy.

**Workshop on Road Safety**: was held on January 22, 2020 in collaboration with the Hero Group in the college auditorium. The speaker, with the help of data pertaining to road accidents, emphasised the need to follow traffic rules to students.

**Recruitment Drive of New Voters**: As per the directives of the Election Commission Sveep Ambassador was appointed. A drive to identify new voters and to facilitate the issuing of their voter ID-cards was also undertaken. A workshop was held in the college wherein participants were given a live demonstration about voting machines. These activities were conducted between the month of August and December, 2019.



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**Aadya:** The much awaited festival of NSS, Aadya was held in the college on February 17, 2020. It was supported by GGB, Prakriti and several other organizations. Many NGOs were invited to showcase their activities. A variety of competitions were held during Aadya.

**Projects and Workshops**: Throughout the year NSS volunteers also worked on the following projects:

- Project Specially Abled: scribes as asked for by NAB were provided.
- Project Sensitization: the following workshops were conducted:
- Workshop on the issue of depression among men
- A workshop on LGBTQ+ issues
- Three workshops on career counselling
- Project Arts and Craft: remained the lifeline of every activity under taken by NSS. Its role in beautifying the venue through innovative artefacts was evident during Aadya.

Webinar: A Lecture-cum-demonstration through Google Meet on "You, Yoga and the Universe" was organised on June 21, 2020 from 8:00 am to 9:00 am on the occasion on International Yoga Day. Neeraja Hariharan, Grand Master in Hatha Yoga (Srima International School of Transformational Integral Hatha Yoga, Aurovile, Pondicherry) led the session. Many faculty members, students and non-teaching members of the college participated in the webinar.
