8. THAL SAINIK CAMP 2022

AITSC is a prestigious camp of NCC in which cadets from all over India are tested in physical and mental ability skills through various competitions. The camp was held from 14th September 2022 to 25th September 2022 at DG National cadet corps. Two cadets of DCAC NCC namely CDT Vikrant Dangi and CDT Yash Rathi were able to make it to the team of Delhi Directorate.

The TSC is a 12 days camp conducted by NCC in Delhi every year, in which the cadets are selected from all 17 directorates (30+3 cadets from each directorate), by the selection procedure conducting 3 Pre-TSC camps each of 10–12 days in a week's interval. The cadets from different states and regions participate in this camp. The selected cadets are sent to the TSC to represent their respective directorates. At first, the cadets are given a chance to participate in the obstacles and firing test in which the cadets should have good stamina and regular practice of push ups and running. Other competitions like Judging distance, Health and hygiene, Field signals, Map reading, Tent pitching, and Line area are also organized in the TSC camp, which is a good learning experience for the cadets. The cadets are able to gain a lot of knowledge, self-confidence, and leadership qualities.

9. EACH ONE, REACH ONE, TEACH ONE CAMPAIGN

DCAC NCC on the occasion of Teachers' Day which is held on 5th September 2022 took an initiative of conducting an Educational Drive under the campaign EACH ONE REACH ONE TEACH ONE being run by NCC. 17.C - CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION

NCC 'C' Certificate Examination was held on 18 February 2023 and 19 February 2023. The practical exam was conducted on 18th and written exam was conducted on 19th.

(i) Practical

15 NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce Attended the "C Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder. The examination was held at Cariappa Parade Ground Delhi Cant. At around 0845 hours, the investigating officer had an interaction with the

cadets and gave his best wishes before the Commencement of the practical. Around 0900 hours the practical examination was started. First, the cadets moved on to 'Field Craft & Battle Craft and Communication'. In this section viva of all the cadets was conducted. Then, the cadets moved to 'Weapon Drill Test' where they started reporting to the officers and completed the Weapon Drill procedure along with viva. Once Weapon Drill Test was completed, cadets moved to 'Weapon Training' for 'Rifle Kholna Jhorna'. After the mantling and dismantling of SLR 7.62mm Rifle, viva of all the cadets was conducted based on topic of weapons and their characteristics. After that, cadets moved for Map Reading test. In the Map Reading test cadets were provided with a prismatic Compass, service protractor and the map to find the true north and grid system on the Map and then viva was conducted on the topic map reading of all the cadets.

(ii) Written Examination

15 NCC cadets of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce Attended the "C Certificate Practical" under the guidance of ANO Lt. Bhupinder. The examination was held at Cariappa Parade Ground Delhi Cant. In the Map Reading test cadets were provided with a prismatic Compass, service protractor and the map to find the true north and grid system on the Map and then viva was conducted on the topic map reading of all the cadets.
