

# SUO-Yuvraj Tyagi




"Responsibility is a privilege"

There was a silence all around the throne, where the saints had often trod.



### KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS



### PARA-SAILING CAMP

The PM's rally, which was conducted by 2-DBN from 28th December 2020 - 28 January 2021. This camp comprised of 3 cadres, final cadre of 13 days was held in the Cariappa parade ground, Delhi Cantt. For the 1st cadre, 50 SD and 50 SW cadets were selected on the basis of physical tests initially from their respective units and later by the host unit, 2DBN. Finally, for the final cadre, 22 SW CDTs and 23 SD CDTs were selected on the basis of overall observation, mainly flying and discipline.

The cadets were first attached to the parachute with the help of an attachment called carabineer, then to the Gypsy, the Gypsy then towed the cadet towards the direction of the flow of the wind. Cadets were taught the basic precautions of parachute flying such as paddling until reaching the height of 5 feet above the ground emergency landings during unfavorable wind direction, wearing the Harness, helmet, knee guard, elbow guard properly to technicalities such as differentiating between various ropes of parachute, pulling the break rope on our own under emergency landings etc.

During the camp, cadets were also taught other activities such as tent pitching which fulfills the very motive of making them self reliant. This camp stands out as laying an adventurous spirit among the cadets by bestowing flight aspects to them on ground.

The CO of the host unit with his exceedingly professional PI staff made sure every cadet throws out the fear of being airborne all at once and instill the spirit of thrill and adventure. The camp showed the true importance of team spirit to the cadets, as they all work in team all throughout the camp. All these activities were undertaken by strictly following the COVID protocols.




# Webinar:



# WEBINAR: Women's Safety





Ex-JUO Utkarsh's POP is scheduled to be held on 28 May 2021.




### EX-SUO NISHKARSH MALVIYA


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


